## Agenda 59.1 : Opening remarks by the Vice Chancellor

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor welcomed Sh. Sandeep Kumar Singh, IAS, Special Secretary, Finance Department, Government of NCT of Delhi; Dr. O.P. Shukla, Joint Director, Directorate of Training and Technical Education, Government of NCT of Delhi; Sh. Anil Kumar, Dy. Director, Directorate of Higher Education; Sh. Binod Doley, Registrar, DTU and other special invitees in the 59<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Board of Management.

Thereafter, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor highlighted some of the achievements/events in DTU since the last meeting of the Board of Management as under:

1. The **Department of Science and Technology (DST)**, Government of India, has granted Delhi Technological University (formerly DCE) a renowned research grant of **₹1 crore** to create an Undergraduate **Laboratory in Quantum Technologies**. The goal of this program is to give undergraduate students practical experience and research exposure in cutting-edge quantum technologies.
2. The Vice Chancellor was pleased to announce that **Dr. Harish Panghal**, who recently earned his doctorate in structural engineering from Delhi Technological University's Department of Civil Engineering, has been granted the **esteemed Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions Postdoctoral Fellowship, which is supported by the European Commission**. One of Europe's most distinguished and competitive international research grants, the MSCA Fellowship supports exceptional researchers across the globe.
3. **Prof. Abhay Karandikar, Hon'ble Secretary, DST**, officially opened the **multidisciplinary Department of Geospatial Science and Technology** at Delhi Technological University (formerly DCE). He emphasized the increasing significance of geographical data in AI and envisioned the department as a national model center with a focus on the **Spatial Internet and GeoAI**.
4. Delhi Technological University (formerly DCE) signed a Memorandum of Understanding with **Navjyoti India Foundation**. **Dr. Kiran Bedi, IPS (Retd.)**, a former lieutenant governor of Puducherry, the founder of Navjyoti Foundation addressed and suggested ways for smooth implementation of the MOU
5. DTU organised the Launch of **ATL Sarthi & Mentor India Academy at DTU, in collaboration with Atal Innovation Mission, NITI Aayog**. The launch brought together educators, students, mentors, and innovation leaders to strengthen school innovation through mentorship and design thinking.
6. Two of DTU innovators have won **₹15 lakh each in the Stealth, Surveillance, and Cyber Defense Technologies category of the esteemed MSME Idea Hackathon 5.0**.

7. The innovative project "**Flying Wing VTOL UAV System with 150 km Range and a Smart Automated Docker Station for 4-Drone Deployment with Auto-fueling, Charging, and AI-based Surveillance**" has earned Anshul Sharma, **Startup Founder at DTU Incubator, recognition**. The concept has great promise for improving defense technologies and unmanned aerial systems. DTU student Chitwan Tejan has also received recognition for his creative project "Drone Forensics," which tackles new issues in forensic analysis and drone security.
8. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor was happy to announce that **Sant Rajinder Singh Ji Maharaj**, a well-known spiritual leader and Head of Science of Spirituality at DTU, officially opened the **Science of Spirituality (SOS) Meditation Center** on 9th April. The center's goals are to support students' holistic growth, meditation practices, and value-based education.
9. The Vice Chancellor also informed that on April 10, 2026, Delhi Technological University, in partnership with Hilti India Pvt. Ltd., **opened an Industry-Supported Laboratory through its Center of Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction (CoEDRR)** and Department of Civil Engineering. The establishment of the facility under the Department of Civil Engineering's Earthquake Technology Laboratory is a major step toward enhancing industry-academia cooperation.
10. **SemiXthon, a Hardware Hackathon** was hosted by the Vinod Dham Centre of Excellence for Semiconductors and Microelectronics (VDSemiX), DTU, on behalf of the Semicon Society, on 13th April 2026.
11. On April 17, 2026, Delhi Technological University hosted the **felicitation ceremony for female students who were chosen for the Rupa Rahul Bajaj National Scholarship for Women in Engineering**. 11 deserving female students from B.Tech programs received awards
12. Delhi Technological University successfully arranged the "**Viksit Bharat Yuva Connect**" (VBYCP) program, a flagship project of the Indian government's Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, which was carried out via the Mera Yuva Bharat-MY Bharat platform.
13. DTU organised Golden Pride Function for Felicitating PhD awardees, Gold medal receivers and scholarship holders on 10th March 2026
14. Organised ENGIFEST 2026 and Ahvaan, the Sports festival 2026
15. At HackIITK 2026, a national cybersecurity competition organized by C3iHub at IIT Kanpur, **Team EHAX from Delhi Technological University** won the third place, valued of ₹1,00,000. In a 15-hour overnight CTF test that covered cryptography, web exploitation, reverse engineering, and digital forensics, the team—Tarush Sonakya, Kartik Vats, Stavva Pathak, and Tushar Singh Bisht—performed exceptionally well.
16. Two DTU teams won the **Harit Manthan 2026 National Hackathon**, a **prestigious national-level** innovation program run by the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) and the Udhmodya Foundation. The winners received up to ₹10 lakhs in incubation support.
17. DTU Organised the NCC festival, 'Samanth 2026'.

18. On April 22, 2026, at the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Auditorium, the Hostel Office of Delhi Technological University (formerly DCE) held "**The Hostel Council Felicitation and Awards Distribution Ceremony**" to honor the contributions of Hostel Council members and commemorate the Hostel Leadership and Innovation Initiative. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor and Chief Warden, spoke at the event and stressed the importance of turning dorms into places for professional growth.

1. 2. The committee deliberated on policy adopted and activities for which remuneration paid at their respective institutes and proposed the followings:

- (1) One basic principle is observed while allowing remuneration for any duty is that the duty should be performed beyond office hours or on holidays. Any duty performed during office hour is not compensated in the form of remuneration.
- (2) In technical institutes, no remuneration is paid to the regular faculty for those duties which are part of their job mandated to them. Such duties include;
  - (i) Taking classes for courses mandated to the institution
  - (ii) Extra classes for academically weaker students
  - (iii) Revision of syllabus/course
  - (iv) Preparation of question papers
  - (v) Invigilation duty during examinations
  - (vi) Checking of Answer Sheets
  - (vii) Duties assigned with respect to academic administration
  - (viii) Nominated members in internal committees including fee concession committee
  - (ix) Any other examination related work and other duty in the line and spirit of above.

- (3) Remuneration is allowed in technical institutions and universities for following, but not limited to;
  - (i) For conducting student counselling and admission.
  - (ii) For screening of applications for recruitment and interview.
  - (iii) For any other work or duties that are performed during non-office hours or on non-working days with prior permission.
- (4) For evening classes, Executive Development programs and training programs conducted under external sponsorship the faculty involved are duly remunerated. However, no travel cost is paid to them if they draw transport allowance as a component of their salary.
- (5) Remuneration is allowed to academic & non-teaching staff if the duties are performed on non-working days as assigned **with prior permission/approval of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor**, if such duties are performed on working days this will not be remunerated.
- (6) Remuneration is also allowed to the recruitment committee members such as for Screening of Applications, Conduct of Screening/Recruitment Test/Admission Test, Screening Test Cum Result Declaration Committee, Presentation/Selection/Interview Committee as per prescribed rates.
- (7) Non-teaching staff if allowed to work on non-working days or beyond office hour **with prior permission/approval of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor** are compensated in the form of remuneration.
- (8) Temporary increase in duties or temporary assignment of additional duties to be performed on working hours are not ordinary be remunerated unless this is specifically allowed by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. However, for any duty assigned to anyone it is ensured that he/she is not overloaded beyond his capacity.
- (9) Committee members discussed the existing rates of remuneration. The committee deliberated revised remuneration for admission, recruitment and examination duties on non-working days.

**Recommendations of the Committee:**

1. The Committee agrees over content in point 1 to 8.
2. The committee recommended the remuneration for Admissions, Recruitment and Examination related activities in DTU which were placed as Annexure in the Agenda note.
3. Number of Committee members and associate staff may be varied as per discretion of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.
4. Remuneration to outside experts/invites/member will continue as per existing rates as per notification No. DTU/Council/BOM-Notification/71/205/604 dated 25.03.2025.

5. Remuneration to the Technical & Non-teaching employees for work done on non-working days or beyond office hour **with prior permission/approval of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor** will be as per office order no. DTU/G.A/184/2018-19/1108/19 dated 11.04.2019.
6. The rate of remuneration is revised from the previous orders keeping into mind disparity in previous rates for different roles, nature and bulk of duties and responsibilities involved in each role.
7. Rates mentioned may be reviewed and revised after three years.
8. Any other remuneration/honorarium not covered under these recommendations but required as per exigencies, may be decided by the competent authority.

**Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the proposed revision of remuneration in respect of various activities of the University.**

## Agenda 59.6 : Implementation of Flexible Cadre Structure in DTU.

The Board of Management was hereby apprised that a Committee was constituted by the Competent Authority vide Office Order No. 1/2-904/2024/Estt./DTU/1410 dated 22.08.2025 and further the committee was amended vide office order dated 12/12/2025 to adjust the positions of faculty members promoted under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) and to implement the Flexible Cadre Structure (FCS) in accordance with the AICTE Regulations, 2019. The implementation is to be done without disturbing the reservation roster and policies of DTU.

The Committee, in its meetings held on 26.08.2025 and 09.09.2025, 26/02/2026, 23.03.2026 and 10/04/2026 recommended the adoption of the Flexible Cadre Structure for DTU in accordance with the AICTE Regulations, 2019. The recommendations are based on the total sanctioned posts of Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors, as approved by the Government of NCT of Delhi, vis-à-vis the existing faculty strength, including promotions under CAS. The flexible Cadre Structure is implemented in DTU on the basis of vacancies available as per the duly signed rosters by Liaison Offices of SC/ST & Liaison Officers of OBC DTU. The overall sanctioned strength, filled positions, and vacancies remain unchanged; however, the new structure will result in an increased number of Professors and Associate Professors in positions and vacancies will be increase at the level of Assistant Professors. The following are the norms of AICTE Notification dated 01/03/2019:

- (i) Incumbent faculty members be upgraded to higher positions, after being eligible through a process of promotion to be held annually, irrespective of availability of Vacancy in that cadre.
- (ii) The incumbent so upgraded to higher position shall be re-designated as Assistant Professor (Senior Scale)/Assistant Professors (Selection Grade)/ Associate Professor/ Professor as the case may be.
- (iii) With this cadre structure, more faculty members may become Professors/Associate Professor at some point of time as a result of which, cadre ratio as an example may become skewed such as 9:0:0 or 8:1:0 or 5:1:3 etc. but in any case it should not be 0:0:9 or 0:1:8 or 0:2:7.
- (iv) The total numbers of minimum faculty positions remain the same as calculated from faculty: student ratio, through the cadre ratio is improving with these promotions.
- (v) The lower post can be treated vacant once the incumbent moves on higher post through promotions or through direct selection by keeping total sanctioned posts of all cadres put together as fixed.
- (vi) This vacant post will be filled by suitable eligible incumbent possessing required qualifications.

- (vii) If a suitable candidate is not available, the post shall be filled by open selection.
- (viii) The open selection/promotion shall be made by a committee constituted as per norms published in this gazette.
- (ix) The candidate shall be promoted from lower cadre to higher cadre as and when they complete eligibility criteria for the higher cadre, irrespective of availability of post in that cadre.

The committee, based on the total sanctioned posts of Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors, as approved by the Government of NCT of Delhi, vis-à-vis the existing faculty strength, including promotions under CAS and recommends that the flexible Cadre Structure may implemented in DTU on the basis of vacancies available as per the dully signed rosters by Liaison Offices of SC/ST & Liaison Officers of OBC DTU. The overall sanctioned strength, filled positions, and vacancies remain unchanged; however, the new structure will result in an increased number of Professors and Associate Professors in positions and vacancies will be increase at the level of Assistant Professors.

**The recommendations of the committee after due deliberations are as follows:**

1. The **roster of DTU** may be **updated** as per the department-wise details provided in *Annexures A to X*. The vacancies have been determined after adjusting the faculty positions in accordance with the provisions laid down under the **AICTE Regulations, 2019** pertaining to the **Flexible Cadre Structure (FCS)**, without disturbing the existing **reservation roster** and **reservation policies** of DTU.

2. The **Flexible Cadre Structure**, as prescribed by AICTE, may be **implemented as per institutional requirements**, and the relevant vacancies may be **reviewed and assessed periodically** to facilitate timely filling of positions in DTU.

As discussed in the 58<sup>th</sup> BoM meeting held on 18.03.2026, and in the concluding remarks, Special Secretary, Finance, GNCTD (Nominee of Pr. Secretary, Finance, GNCTD) expressed his concern over 50% vacancies in teaching posts and 75% vacancies in non-teaching posts and advised to fill these vacant posts as soon as possible. Implementation of Flexible Cadre System will expedite the recruitment process.

The Board of Management is requested to kindly approve the implementation of the Flexible Cadre System at DTU in accordance with the AICTE Regulations, 2019 and grant permission to recruit for vacant positions on a mission mode basis.

The copy of minutes of the committee were placed as Annexure along with other documents also placed at Annexure.

**Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the implementation of proposed Flexi Cadre Structure in the University.**

**Agenda 59.7 : Amendment in proposal for creation of library cadre posts in Delhi Technological University.**

The Board of Management was apprised that the existing posts of Library cadre were sanctioned in erstwhile DCE in the pay scale of College level. The sanctioned posts for erstwhile DCE library were 05 (01 Librarian, 02 Dy. Librarian and 03 Assistant Librarian). Due to disparities in pay scales compared to other premier institutions and universities, DTU unable to fill these vacancies. However, as stopgap arrangement, a Librarian and Assistant Librarian have been engaged through re-employment and contractual basis.

The Board of Management, DTU in its 50<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 14.03.2024, approved the proposal for creation of additional posts along with revised Recruitment Rules (in pay scales recommended by UGC) and recommended the same to the Government for sanction.

The proposal for revision of pay-scales and creation of additional posts was submitted to DTTE, GNCTD on 29.10.2024 as detailed below:

Thereafter, DTTE advised to separate the proposals for creation of posts and revision of pay scale. Accordingly, the proposal was separated in two files i.e. one for "Revision of Pay Scales for the post of Librarian, Dy. Librarian and Assistant Librarian" and other for "Creation for the post of Dy. Librarian and Assistant Librarian, DTU".

The file pertaining to the revision of Pay Scale for the post of Librarian, Dy. Librarian and Assistant Librarian was returned from DTTE, GNCTD with following observations:

1. *DTU has submitted that the Librarian appointed in the erstwhile Delhi College of Engineering (DCE) retired in 2022. It has further been stated that as the scales of the sanctioned posts are not relevant for University (as per UGC norms) and therefore, these posts i.e. Dy. Librarian and Assistant Librarian could not be filled after formation of University in regular mode. The Delhi Technological University was formed in 2009.*
2. *In this regard, it is observed that the posts of Dy. Librarian and Assistant Librarian are lying vacant since 2009 (More than 05 years) and as per OM dt. 5<sup>th</sup> January 2024 "A post lying vacant for more than 5 years from the date of creation or date falling vacant, shall stand abolished". Accordingly, these posts fall under category of "ABOLISH".*
3. *However, DTU has submitted the file for revision of pay scales for the post of Librarian, Dy. Librarian and Assistant Librarian of DTU, while, the posts are lying under the category of ABOLISHMENT.*

Further, DTTE has advised to submit a fresh proposal in view of above.

In this regard, referred above OM dated 05.01.2024 under para-5.1, 5.2 & 5.3 states that:

**5. Abolition and Revival of Posts:**

- 5.1 *A post lying vacant for more than 5 years from the date of creation or date or falling vacant, shall stand abolished.*
- 5.2 *In cases where*
  - (i) *the recruitment process has been initiated within 4 years of the creation/arising of vacancy and is underway but appointment orders have not been issued within the period of 5 years, or*
  - (ii) *there are specific Court directions requiring the filling of a post, or*
  - (iii) *filling of posts was delayed due to Court orders on finalization of seniority lists/filling of the posts etc., or*
  - (iv) *promotion posts under reservation quota could not be filled due to non-availability of eligible candidates in the feeder grade or posts are essential for functioning of the*

*organization and for which matching savings can be provided by the organization by surrendering live posts without compromising the hierarchy of the Cadre or affecting the promotional channel of the feeder grades in the same hierarchy.*

*The posts may be revived with prior approval of Department of Expenditure.*

5.3 *In cases, where the organization is prevented from filling the vacancy due to circumstances specified in para 5.2 and where sufficient justification exists for continuation of the post, proposals for revival shall be submitted to Department of Expenditure through Integrated Finance Division (IFD) along with a detailed chronology of events indicating the circumstance which led to non-filling of the vacancy and functional justification for revival with the approval of Secretary of Administrative Ministry/Department as per prescribed checklist. Revival would be considered only in the circumstances mentioned in para 5.2.*

In view of above and as per advise of DTTE, the Board of Management was requested to approve the abolishment of the existing 05 posts (01 Librarian, 02 Dy. Librarian and 03 Assistant Librarian) of Library cadre sanctioned in erstwhile DCE and creation of these posts in the pay scale as per UGC norms. After approval of the Board of Management, the proposal will be submitted to the Government of NCT of Delhi for sanction.

**Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the abolishment of the existing 05 posts (01 Librarian, 02 Dy. Librarian and 03 Assistant Librarian) of Library cadre sanctioned in erstwhile DCE and for creation of these posts in the Pay Scale as per UGC norms for universities.**

**Agenda 59.8 : Amendment in Age Criteria in the recruitment rules for the posts of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor in DTU.**

The Board was apprised that in the 58<sup>th</sup> meeting of Board of Management held on 18.03.2026 vide agenda item no. 58.5, an agenda related to **revision of age criteria in the Recruitment Rules** for Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor in DGST was placed before the Board for kind consideration and decision. In this regard, the Board has decided that: -

*The Board of Management considered and approved for implementation of setting the maximum age at 65 years (retirement age) for the faculty posts of Assistant Professors/across all faculty cadres i.e. Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors as per AICTE/UGC guidelines without any changes in academic qualification or experience prescribed under the respective RRs.*

It was observed that there is some ambiguity/confusion regarding maximum age for inviting the applications in the other disciplines/ departments as in the decision the maximum age at 65 years (retirement) is mentioned.

It was mentioned that in the existing Recruitment Rules, the maximum age limit for applying to the post of Assistant Professor is 35 years, for Associate Professor is 50 years and for Professor is 55 years.

In view of the above, to avoid any ambiguity and maintaining the parity, the Board considered the age criteria as '**No Age bar**' for applying to the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor in all the disciplines/departments of DTU. The Recruitment Rules be also modified accordingly.

**Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the proposed amendment in Age Criteria i.e. 'No Age bar' in the RRs for applying to the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor.**

**Agenda 59.9 : Procurement of 01 no. of new 35 seaters, Non-AC, CNG Bus against the condemnation of old bus.**

The Board of Management was apprised that one Bus (Swaraj Mazda, CNG, 35 seater) has been condemned after completion of prescribed life. Details of the same are as under:

The condemned Bus used to pick-up and drop the students and staff members of the university from the nearest metro stations (Rithala and Badli) six times a day. Additionally, the Bus was also used for local industrial visit by the students. After condemnation of the said bus, its services have been discontinued, causing significant inconvenience to students and staff members.

To meet the immediate requirement of bus, it was proposed to replace above mentioned condemned vehicles with a new 35 seaters, non-AC, CNG Bus to resume transport service to the students and the staff members.

The tentative cost of the above vehicles on GeM portal is Rs. 25 Lakhs approximately.

*Discussion : Dr. O.P. Shukla, Joint Director, DTTE suggested for procurement of Air-conditioned Bus in place of Non-AC Bus for convenience of the students and staff members of the University.*

**Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved for procurement of 01 no. of new 35-seaters, Air Conditioned, CNG Bus against the condemnation of old bus.**

**Agenda 59.10 : Matter for Ratification:**

**i. Annual Report (2024-25) of the University.**

It was submitted that the Annual Report (2024-25) of the University has been prepared and approved by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. The Annual Report (2024-25) was tabled in the meeting for ratification.

The Board of Management was apprised that a committee was constituted vide office order no. F.No. 1/DTU/Rectt. Reg.(T)/Notification/2017-18/938 to revise the Recruitment Regulations (RR) for the post of Assistant Professor in all the concerned departments of the DTU.

The committee reviewed the RRs (2019) for Assistant Professor of DTU, the Recruitment Guidelines (2019) of All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) along with relevant clarifications. The committee deliberated and approved the separated specifications of relevant branches/discipline for UG and PG/Ph.D. levels in the RRs. This distinction has been incorporated to ensure greater clarity and transparency in eligibility criteria while accommodating the interdisciplinary nature of higher education and research. It will enable the University to attract a wider and more suitable pool of candidates, ensure better alignment of qualifications with teaching and research requirements.

To ensure uniformity, a comprehensive framework for Recruitment Regulations has been formulated. This framework defines educational qualifications in alignment with AICTE/UGC norms and other regulatory bodies. Inputs regarding relevant branches/disciplines at both UG and PG/Ph.D branches were sought from all academic Heads of Departments. Based on the responses received, the relevant branches/disciplines have been incorporated.

The Committee recommended the revision of the Recruitment Rules for the post of Assistant Professor in the following departments:
