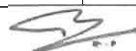

Agenda 58.4 : Change of nomenclature of sanctioned posts and Revision/Review of Recruitment Regulations (RRs) for various Technical Posts of the University.

The Board of Management was apprised that a Committee was constituted Authority to revise/ review the Recruitment Regulations for various Technical posts of the University vide office order 2144 dated 26/11/2024.

The Committee met on 03/09/2025, 14/11/2025 and 11/12/2025 for revision/ review the Recruitment Regulation for various posts of the University, the committee considered the Recruitment Rules approval by the Board of Management in its meeting held 23.02.2018 and Notification No. F.DTU/Rectt./RR/Notification/2016/17/598, 602, 592 and 593 dated 16.04.2018. The Committee also considered the Model Recruitment Regulations (RRs) of UGC notice no F. No.7-1/202 (JCRC) dated 27.09.2022 for the various technical posts.

After detailed discussion and deliberation, the Committee proposed the revised Recruitment Regulations (RRs) for the post of Junior Mechanic, Junior Technical Assistant, Technical Assistant, Senior Technical Assistant Grade –II and Senior Technical Assistant Grade-I of the University are placed at **Annexure pages 01 to 16.**

The Committee further observed that the Pay Level of Foremen and Draughtsman are same as Pay Level of Sr. Technical Assistant Grade-II i.e. Level 6. Also, Pay Level of Senior Mechanic is same as Pay-Level of Technical Assistant i.e. Level 5.

The committee is of the view that these posts may be sent to Govt. of NCT of Delhi for changing of nomenclature as per model RR of UGC as mentioned below:

Further, as per DTU status 10(h), the BOM is empowered to prescribe qualification and other conditions of eligibility for non-teaching staff.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the Recruitment Regulations (RRs) for various Technical Posts of the University as recommended by the Committee. Further, the Board also approved to send the proposal to Government of NCT of Delhi for change in nomenclature of sanctioned posts created in erstwhile DCE.

Agenda 58.5 : Revision of Age Criteria in the recruitment rules for Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor in DGST.

The Board was apprised that the current DTU RRs lay down specific Age and Experience criteria for recruitment of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors. Besides, in the existing RRs, there is no minimum experience requirement for the posts of Assistant Professors. Restricting recruitment based on maximum Age but not laying down any requirement of experience with Assistant Professors may prove to be counterproductive in a scenario where experienced and willing personnel may be available both from academics and industry, and also where most of the Universities/Colleges which act as a catchment for recruitment in DTU may have already implemented the Flexible Cadre System as per AICTE notification which allows the merger of all the different categories of assistant, associate and professors. Although DTU is still in the process of implementing the Flexible Cadre System, However, the above mentioned age restrictions without any requirement of experience are likely to affect the quality of recruitment in DTU.

Further, a survey of the AICTE notifications, UGC regulations and some University RRs wrt Age criteria indicates the following -

- (a) AICTE regulations do not give any specific Age restrictions on faculty recruitment.
- (b) UGC clearly stipulates that there is no age limit for the recruitment of Assistant Professors.
- (c) Similarly, the details available on the website of IIT Bombay does not specify any age restriction and Delhi University (SGBT) RR indicate that there are no age restrictions on recruitment of Assistant Professors.

A specific case in point in DTU is that of the newly established multidisciplinary Department of Geospatial Science and Technology (GST). In order to meet minimum essential requirement of faculty in the Department, a Committee was constituted with the approval of competent authority to identify vacancies from various Departments for temporary transfer to the Department. The Committee identified and recommended transfer of 02 posts of Associate Professor and 06 posts of Assistant Professor to the Department. This was done so that an appropriate hierarchy may be created in the newly established Department of Geospatial Science and Technology. However, BOM vide its supplementary Agenda Item No 57.32 (refer Annexure 6) while approving the transfer also laid down that after implementation of Flexible Cadre System, since no vacancies may be available for the post of Associate Professors in the concerned Departments, therefore it merged the posts of Associate Professors (02 posts) with Assistant Professors (06 posts) and recommended transfer of 08



posts of Assistant Professors to the Department of GST. During framing of RRs for the posts of Assistant Professors for the Department of GST, it was realized that if the existing age restrictions are levied, the Department may lose out on many experienced faculty/industry personnel who though may be willing to join but will not be eligible due to age limitations and no requirement of experience.

It is, therefore, proposed that in view of the AICTE and UGC guidelines mentioned in the previous paragraph, the age restrictions in the RRs may be revised and set at 65 years (retirement age) for recruitment across all the cadres for the posts of Assistant Professors or across all cadres, i.e., Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved for implementation of setting the maximum age at 65 years (retirement age) for the faculty posts of Assistant Professors / across all faculty cadres i.e. Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors as per AICTE/UGC guidelines without any changes in academic qualification or experience prescribed under the respective RRs.



Agenda 58.6 : Unauthorized foreign visits of Prof. Seema Singh, Department of Humanities

The Board of Management was apprised that Prof. Seema Singh was appointed as Lecturer (Economics) on 22.01.1999 at DTU (erstwhile DCE) in department of Humanities and at present she is working as Professor of Economics since 11.11.2012 in the Department of Humanities, DTU.

Prof. Seema Singh has visited various countries without approval of the Competent Authority and the same has been brought into the knowledge of DTTE being the Cadre Controlling Authority of erstwhile DCE employees.

The DTTE has communicated that **Secretary TTE has provided his remarks that *Foreign visits, that too multiple occasions, looks grave violation, the VC of the University be asked to keep it before the BOM/BOG of the University, in its coming meeting as an agenda with full details and explanation of the staff, so that the BOM/BOG takes view on any minor/major penalty.*** The details of unauthorised foreign visits under taken by Prof. Seema Singh are as under :

The Board of Management was apprised that vide File No. F.DTU/Recruitment/2024/F-500A/3181 (Advertisement No. 04/2024) dated 24/09/2024, DTU advertised for three statutory position of the University i.e Registrar, Controller of Finance & Controller of Examination.

In pursuance of University's Memorandum No. F.1/2-942/2025/Estt./DTU/1874 dated 03.11.2025 and consequent upon reporting for joining to the post of Registrar, Sh. Binod Doley has been taken on the strength of the University w.e.f. 18.11.2025 (F/N) vide office order No. 2180 dated 02.12.2025 and his pay is fixed in Level-14, Cell-1 with basic pay of ₹1,44,200/- under 7th CPC.

In response to the above said office order dated 02.12.2025, Sh. Binod Doley, Registrar has submitted vide letter 03.12.2025 requesting that his last basic pay drawn at MANIT Bhopal be considered for pay protection while fixing the pay at DTU.

In this regard, it is submitted that Sh. Binod Doley has applied in DTU for the post of Registrar through proper channel by granting NOC from Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology Bhopal. Thereafter, consequent upon his selection as Registrar in DTU, he has been relieved from Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology Bhopal vide their office order bearing No.AB/Estt/2025/1671 dated 29.08.2025.

It is pertinent to mention here that as per Experience Certificate issued from Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology Bhopal, he was drawing basic pay of Rs.1,67,200/- in Level 14, Cell-6 under 7th CPC.

Further, following are the provision laid down in the **FR 22(I)** in regard to pay protection:-

- (a) If a Government servant has previously held substantively or officiated in the same post, then his initial pay shall not be less than the pay which he drew on the last occasion, and such period on previous occasion shall also count for increment in the stage of the time scale equivalent to the pay.
- (b) If a Government servant has previously held substantively or officiated in a permanent or temporary post on the same time-scale, then his initial pay shall not be less than the pay which he drew on the last occasion, and such period on previous occasion shall also count for increment in the stage of the time scale equivalent to that pay.

Ongoing through the provisions outlined above of the FR 22(I) pay protection mentioned under above, it may be seen that case of the present incumbent is broadly covered the provision FR(I) (d). It is further stated that, if the last basic pay drawn by an officer appointed to a statutory post is not duly protected, the University shall face significant difficulty in attracting experienced and competent officers.

The request of pay protection was forwarded to Accounts Branch for examination. Accounts branch has examined the file and replied that, the matter is purely administrative and establishment may decide the matter as FR 22(I) (d).

Accordingly, in view of the provisions elucidated above, the Finance Committee and Board of Management may sympathetically consider fixing the pay of Sh. Binod Doley, Registrar, DTU, at ₹1,67,200/- with effect from the date of his joining, i.e., 18.11.2025 (F/N), by protecting the last pay drawn by him at Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology Bhopal.

The matter was placed before the Finance Committee (FC) in its 41st meeting held on 02.03.2026. The Finance Committee recommended to send the proposal to Finance Department, GNCTD for their concurrence. The detailed minutes of the 41st meeting of the Finance Committee will be tabled during the meeting.

Decision : The Board of Management considered the recommendations of the Finance Committee and approved to send the matter to the Finance Department, GNCTD for their concurrence.



Agenda 58.8 : Pay protection of Sh. Girish Chandra Prasad, Controller of Finance, DTU.

The Board of Management was apprised that vide File No. F.DTU/Recruitment/2024/F-500A/3181 (Advertisement No. 04/2024) dated 24/09/2024, DTU advertised for three statutory position of the University i.e Registrar, Controller of Finance & Controller of Examination.

In pursuance of University's Memorandum No. F.1/2-940/2025/Estt./DTU/1397 dated 21.08.2025 and consequent upon reporting for joining to the post of Controller of Finance (COF), Sh. Girish Chandra Prasad has been taken on the strength of the University w.e.f. 09.09.2025 (A/N) vide office order No. 1695 dated 08.10.2025 and his pay is fixed in Level-14, Cell-1 with basic pay of ₹1,44,200/-under 7th CPC.

In response to the above said office order dated 08.10.2025, Sh. Girish Chandra Prasad, Controller of Finance (COF) has submitted vide letter 16.12.2025 requesting that his last basic pay drawn at Bihar Animal Sciences University (BASU) be considered for pay protection while fixing the pay at DTU.

Vide his application dated 16.12.2025, Sh. Girish Chandra Prasad, Controller of Finance (COF) has intimated that he joined DTU as COF in Pay level 14 after fulfilling the eligibility condition prescribed in the recruitment rule for this post in DTU from the tenure post on pay level 14 held by him on regular basis in his previous employment. So his initial pay shall not be less than the pay that he has drawn on the last occasion, that mentioned in the pay slip issued from his previous employer.

Accordingly, ongoing through the documents provide by , Sh. Girish Chandra Prasad, Controller of Finance (COF), it is submitted that he has worked in Bihar Animal Science University for the period of 5 years from June 2018 to June 2023 and as per LPC is last basic pay was 1,53,000/-. Thereafter, he was appointed as Financial Advisor (Consultant) on per visit basis at IIT, Patna from 2023.

Further, following are the provision laid down in the **FR 22(I)** in regard to pay protection:-

- (a) If a Government servant has previously held substantively of officiated in the same post, then his initial pay shall not be less than the pay which he drew on the last occasion, and such period on previous occasion shall also count for increment in the stage of the time scale equivalent to the pay.

The Finance Committee recommended to send the proposal to Finance Department, GNCTD for their concurrence. The detailed minutes of the 41st meeting of the Finance Committee will be tabled during the meeting.

Decision : The agenda was withdrawn.

Agenda 58.9 : Pay protection of Dr. Nupur Srivastava, Controller of Examination, DTU.

The Board of Management was hereby apprised that vide File No. F.DTU/Recruitment/2024/F-500A/3181 (Advertisement No. 04/2024) dated 24/09/2024, DTU advertised for three statutory position of the University i.e Registrar, Controller of Finance & Controller of Examination.

In pursuance of University's Memorandum No. F.1/2-943/2025/ Estt./DTU/1875 dated 03.11.2025 and consequent upon reporting for joining to the post of Controller of Examination (COE), Dr. Nupur Srivastava has been taken on the strength of the University w.e.f. 16.12.2025 (F/N) vide office order No. 2423 dated 26.12.2025 and her pay is fixed in Level-14, Cell-1 with basic pay of ₹1,44,200/-under 7th CPC.

In response to the above said office order dated 16.12.2025, Dr. Nupur Srivastava, COE has submitted vide e-mail dated 12.01.2026 requesting that her last basic pay drawn at Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak, be considered for pay protection while fixing the pay at DTU.

In this regard, it is submitted that Dr. Nupur Srivastava has applied in DTU for the post of Controller of Examination (COE) through proper channel by granting NOC from IGNTU, Amarkantak. Thereafter, consequent upon her selection as COE in DTU, she has been relieved from IGNTU, Amarkantak vide their relieving office order bearing No.IGNTU/A&E/2025/92 dated 15.12.2025.

It is pertinent to mention here that as per Last Pay Certificate issued from IGNTU, she was drawing basic pay of Rs.1,48,500/- in Level 14, Cell-2 under 7th CPC.

Further, following are the provision laid down in the **FR 22(I)** in regard to pay protection:-

- (a) If a Government servant has previously held substantively or officiated in the same post, then his initial pay shall not be less than the pay which he drew on the last occasion, and such period on previous occasion shall also count for increment in the stage of the time scale equivalent to the pay.
- (b) If a Government servant has previously held substantively or officiated in a permanent or temporary post on the same time-scale, then his initial pay shall not be less than the pay which he drew on the last occasion, and such period on previous occasion shall also count for increment in the stage of the time scale equivalent to that pay.

The detailed minutes of the 41st meeting of the Finance Committee will be tabled during the meeting.

Decision : The agenda was withdrawn.



Agenda 58.10 : Provision of Imprest Rs. 50,000/- to OIC (Store Section)

The Board of Management was apprised that imprest of Rs. 50,000/- has been delegated to the Heads of different Units to meet day-to-day and urgent expenditures. However, there is presently no provision of imprest in favour of the OIC (Store section).

The Store Section is required to incur small and minor expenditures for its smooth functioning, such as:

- (i) Purchase of office supplies and stationery
- (ii) Minor repair and maintenance works
- (iii) Urgent miscellaneous expenditures
- (iv) Purchase of essential items on urgent basis for departments/centers of the University

In the absence of an imprest facility, meeting such urgent requirements becomes difficult and may cause operational delays.

Therefore, it is proposed that an imprest amount of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand Only) be sanctioned in favour of the OIC (Store Section), subject to adherence to the prescribed financial rules and submission of recoupment statements.

The matter was placed before the Finance Committee (FC) in its 41st meeting held on 02.03.2026. The Finance Committee recommended the proposal to the Board of Management for approval. The detailed minutes of the 41st meeting of the Finance Committee will be tabled during the meeting.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the recommendations of Finance Committee for grant of Rs. 50,000/- as imprest money to OIC (Store Section).



Agenda 58.11 : Revision of Guidelines for providing Electronic Device to Ministerial Officers, DTU

The Board of Management was hereby apprised that a committee was constituted to revise the Guideline for Providing Electronic Device to Ministerial Offices of Delhi Technological University.

The Committee held meetings on 10-02-2026, 16-02-2026, and 19-02-2026 and deliberated extensively on the matter in light of the revised instructions for the purchase of laptops/notebooks and similar devices for officers, issued by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India (Department of Expenditure), vide Office Memorandum No. F. No. 03(20)/2022-E. II(A) dated 21 July 2023 and DTU Notification No. DTU/GA/237/2019-20/1161/27.1.2019.

The committee unanimously recommended that based on the functional requirement, following category of officers are eligible for electronic devices:

- 1) Registrar
- 2) Controller of Examinations
- 3) Controller of Finance
- 4) Chief Operating Officer
- 5) Deputy Registrar
- 6) Executive Engineer
- 7) Knowledge Network Manager
- 8) System Manager
- 9) Assistant Registrar
- 10) DCA, Accounts Officers, Sr. Account Officer
- 11) EDP Manager
- 12) Section Officer
- 13) Assistant Account Officer
- 14) All similar officers as decided by the Vice Chancellor from time to time.

The purchase will be made by the officer himself for which a maximum advance of 80% of the total cost may be obtained from the University. The officer will afterward seek reimbursement for the complete amount incurred on such purchases.

The depreciation of the equipment's would be 25% per year (pro-rata basis), on straight line method. The total prescribed life of such computers/equipment will be of four years. In case an officer retires from service or relinquishes the post the officer will deposit the pro-rata cost of the devices as indicated above, it shall be compulsory for the officer to retain the electronic device issued to him/her.

All eligible officers may purchase the desired technology device (s) which the find useful for smooth functioning of the office work. The accessories of these devices may include printer/scanner/multifunctional UPS, Webcam, sound system, storage device, memory card readers, networking equipment's etc.

The cost of all such purchases should be restricted to a maximum ceiling of as indicated in table once in four years. In case, cost of such purchase exceeds this prescribed ceiling the reimbursement shall be restricted to the upper ceiling amount.

The facility will be provided only to officers appointed on a regular basis or to tenure posts in the University.

After having made the requisite purchase (either from his own funds or from the advance taken up to 80% of the total cost), the concerned officer will furnish the utilization/undertaking to the DDO of the University stating clearly that the requisite amount has been spent/utilized on account of purchase of technology devices. On receipt of such a utilization/declaration, the DDO will reimburse the amount to the officer concern directly.

The matter was placed before the Finance Committee (FC) in its 41st meeting held on 02.03.2026. The Finance Committee recommended the proposal to the Board of Management for in-principle approval subject to endorsement of Office Memorandum dated 21 July 2023 by Government of NCT of Delhi. The detailed minutes of the 41st meeting of the Finance Committee will be tabled during the meeting.

Decision : The Board of Management considered the recommendations of Finance Committee and approved in-principle for revision of guidelines for providing electronic device to ministerial officers subject to endorsement of Office Memorandum dated 21 July 2023 by Government of NCT of Delhi.



Agenda 58.12 : Approval for re-appropriation of Budget of DTU-IIF

It was submitted to the Board of Management that in the 39th meeting of the Board of Management of DTU held on 13.11.2020, under Agenda Item 39.15, it was approved that a maximum of 20% of the funds received from all sources, including Grand-in-Aid (GIA), in a financial year may be incurred towards staff salary.

Further, in the 41st meeting of the Board of Management held on 01.03.2021, under Agenda Item 41.15, it was approved for annual grant of Rs. 96 Lacs with 5% yearly enhancement for supporting entrepreneurial activities of MBA (Innovation, Entrepreneurship & Venture Development), MBA (Family Business & Entrepreneurship), B.Tech Entrepreneurship Track, UG/PG Minor in Innovation & Entrepreneurship, and start-ups incubated at DTU-IIF.

In this regard, BoD of DTU-IIF in its 2nd Meeting of "The Board of Directors" of DTU INNOVATION AND INCUBATION FOUNDATION (DTU-IIF) for the year 2025 held on 30.12.2025 recommended that the capping pattern by Board of Management of DTU may be revised to the pattern of University of Delhi, as per E.C. Resolution No.26 dated 18.08.2022, wherein:

- (i) 60% of the total budget shall be utilized for incubation activities, and
- (ii) up to 40% of the total budget shall be utilized for administrative activities, including salary and related expenses.

The matter was placed before the Finance Committee (FC) in its 41st meeting held on 02.03.2026. The Finance Committee recommended the proposal to the Board of Management for approval. The detailed minutes of the 41st meeting of the Finance Committee will be tabled during the meeting.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the recommendations of Finance Committee for re-appropriation of Budget of DTU-IIF.

Agenda 58.13 : Procurement of 02 no's of new vehicles against the 02 no's of Condemned vehicles ie. DL-5CD-9975 (Maruti Van) & DL-10CA-2100 (Honda City).

It was submitted to the Board of Management that at present only 01 vehicle ie. DL- 8CBJ-623 (Eeco) is available in General Pool for performing day-to-day transportation purpose. The University transport office receives large numbers of requisitions for providing for vehicles time to time from various departments. Finance Department, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, vide OM dated 25.02.2021 have issued directives for purchase of Electrical Vehicle by all the Departments of GNCTD. However, it has been observed that the electric vehicle has limited access, limited battery range, limited road mileage, limited charging stations and require long charging time, the lithium ion battery pack of EV is also more environmental harmful than manufacturing process for an average petrol vehicle which is much suitable for University.

DTU is committed to complying with the said Office Memorandum issued by GNCTD. The University is already in the process of procuring two electric buses for staff and students, and four electric carts are currently operational on the campus.

Therefore, it is requested to kindly approve and allow to purchase 02 new vehicles i.e. 01 Honda City car (Elevated VXCVT R) and 01 Maruti DZire (VXI 1.2 L ISS 5MT) against the 02 nos. of condemned vehicle i.e. DL-10CA-2100 Honda City, DL-5CD-9975 Maruti Van.

Agenda 58.14 : In-principle approval for the introduction of the Integrated B.Sc.-M.Sc. Programme in Statistics by the Department of Applied Mathematics.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that in the present data-driven era, Statistics plays a vital role across disciplines such as data science, artificial intelligence, economics, finance, public health, engineering, and policy research. The growing demand for professionals with strong statistical and analytical skills necessitates the introduction of structured and rigorous academic programmes in this domain.

Recognizing the growing academic, industrial, and societal demand for well-trained statisticians, the Department of Applied Mathematics proposes to introduce a five-year Integrated B.Sc.–M.Sc. Programme in Statistics. The integrated format will provide a seamless academic progression from undergraduate to postgraduate levels, ensuring depth in statistical theory, computational skills, and applied learning.

In accordance with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, higher education in India is envisioned to be multidisciplinary, flexible, outcome-oriented, and aligned with societal and industry needs. In this context, Statistics occupies a pivotal position as a core discipline that supports scientific inquiry, technological innovation, policy formulation, and evidence-based decision making.

In view of the above, the **Department of Applied Mathematics** seeks **in-principle approval of the Academic Council** for the introduction of the **Integrated B.Sc.–M.Sc. Programme in Statistics**.

Programme Objectives:

The objectives of the Integrated B.Sc.-M.Sc. Programme in Statistics are to:

1. Provide a strong foundation in statistical theory, probability, and mathematics.
2. Develop proficiency in statistical modeling, data analysis, and interpretation.
3. Equip students with computational and programming skills using modern statistical tools and software.
4. Promote interdisciplinary learning by integrating statistics with computing, economics, and data science.
5. Foster research aptitude and analytical thinking for higher studies and innovation.
6. Prepare students for professional careers in academia, industry, government, and research organizations.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Department of Software Engineering starting integrated B.Sc. & M.Sc. program in Data Science with a duration of 5 years and seat intake of 30.

The departmental BOS members recommended to start integrated B.Sc. & M.Sc. (Data Science) program in the Department of Software Engineering w.e.f. academic session 2026-27.

The matter was also placed before the Academic Council in its 44th meeting held on 26.02.2026 along with the details of the eligibility criteria, scheme and syllabus. The Academic Council considered and recommended the matter to Board of Management for in-principle approval to start integrated B.Sc. & M.Sc. (Data Science) program in the Department of Software Engineering with following stipulation:

1. Eligibility criteria to be revisited and independently evaluated in consonance with the norms of UGC and NEP,2020.
2. All the provisions related to admission should be aligned with the existing framework and admission brochure of the Integrated B.Sc-M.Sc programme of the University.

Agenda 58.16 : In-principle approval of Five-Year Integrated PG Programme – B.Sc.–M.Sc. in Applied Statistics in USME (East Delhi Campus).

It was submitted to the Board of Management that a proposal for the introduction of the Five-Year Integrated Post-Graduate Programme (FYIPP) titled: B.Sc.–M.Sc. Statistics (Honors) with Minor in Economics and Data Science w.e.f. Academic Session 2026–27, along with the Seat Matrix, Admission Criteria, Programme Structure, and First Year Syllabus was considered and approved at the Board of Studies (BOS) meeting of the University School of Management & Entrepreneurship (USME), Delhi Technological University held on 13th February, 2026, East Delhi Campus, DTU.

The matter related to the programme were deliberated and approved in the BOS meeting and proposed to be placed before the Academic Council:

The matter was placed before the Academic Council in its 44th meeting held on 26.02.2026 along with along with the Seat Matrix, Admission Criteria, Programme Structure, and First Year Syllabus. The Academic Council considered the matter and suggested to change the name of the program from B.Sc.–M.Sc. Statistics (Honors) with Minor in Economics and Data Science to B.Sc.–M.Sc. in Applied Statistics.

Further, the Council recommended the matter with above suggestions to Board of Management for in-principle approval of Five Year Integrated PG Programme (FYIPP) – B.Sc.–M.Sc. in Applied Statistics in USME (East Delhi Campus) with following stipulations:

1. The Eligibility criteria to be revisited and independently evaluated in consonance with the norms of UGC and NEP,2020.
2. All the provisions related to admissions should be aligned with the existing framework and admission brochure of the Integrated B.Sc-M.Sc programme of the University.

1. Professor (Chairperson)
2. Four Professors (Members)
3. Student Representative on academic merit/excellence in sports/Co-curricular activities (Special Invitee)

[At least one member or the Chairperson shall be a woman and at least one member or the Chairperson shall be from SC/ST/OBC category.]

The term of the chairperson and members shall be for a period of two years and the term of the special invitee shall be one year.

The quorum for the meeting, including the Chairperson, but excluding the special invitee, shall be three.]

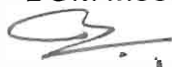

SoPs for Grievance Redressal on receiving a complaint by SGRC:

- On receipt of the complaint, the concerned authority (Head of Department /Deans as applicable) shall refer the complaint to the appropriate Students' Grievance Redressal Committee, along with their comments, within 15 days of receipt of the complaint on the online portal or through a formal application addressed to the Chairperson SGRC.
- The Students' Grievance Redressal Committee, as the case may be, shall fix a date for hearing the complaint which shall be communicated to the aggrieved student.
- An aggrieved student may appear either in person or authorize a representative to present the case.
- The SGRC shall send its report with recommendations, if any, to the competent authority of the institution concerned and a copy thereof to the aggrieved student, preferably within a period of 15 working days from the date of receipt of the complaint.
- Any student aggrieved by the decision of the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee may prefer an appeal to the Ombudsperson, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of such decision.
- Grievances not resolved by the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee within the time period provided in these regulations may be referred to the Vice Chancellor / Ombudsperson by the university.
- The Ombudsperson shall, after giving reasonable opportunities of being heard to the parties concerned, on the conclusion of proceedings, pass such order, with reasons thereof, as may be deemed fit to redress the grievance and provide such relief as may be appropriate to the aggrieved student.
- The aggrieved student, as well as the Chairperson of SGRC, shall be provided with copies of the order under the signature of the Ombudsperson.
- The institution shall comply with the recommendations of the Ombudsperson.
- The Ombudsperson may recommend appropriate action against the complainant, where a complaint is found to be false or frivolous.

INFORMATION REGARDING OMBUDSPERSONS AND STUDENT GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEES:

DTU shall furnish, prominently, on its website and in its prospectus/Student handbook, all relevant information in respect of the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee and the Ombudsperson for the purpose of appeals.

Additional Provisions

- Any grievance sent directly to Vice-Chancellor and Registrar will not be entertained and will be routed through the appropriate level of escalation matrix. No grievance shall be escalated without disposal or acknowledgement at the lower level.



- Anonymous complaints should also be examined at Level-I and escalated as per the escalation matrix. The SGRC will only review anonymous complaints that have first been assessed on the basis of evidence by Responsible Authorities and processed through lower-level resolution channels.
- Complaints related to Ragging must be forwarded to the Anti-Ragging Committee
- For cases of sexual harassment, complaints shall be filed directly with the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and will follow the POSH Act, 2013.
- Digital Grievance Portal / Helpline / Student Facilitation Centre should be integrated for tracking.
- A monthly review report shall be submitted to the Vice Chancellor by SGRC

The matter was placed before the Academic Council in its 44th meeting held on 26.02.2026. The Academic Council considered and recommended the matter to Board of Management for approval the Students Grievance Redressal Policy and Grievance Redressal Escalation matrix with following modifications.

1. In escalation matrix, level should be separated for Vice-Chancellor and Ombudsman i.e. separate level for Ombudsman be created after Vice-Chancellor.
2. Anonymous complaints should also be examined at Level-I and escalated as per the escalation matrix.
3. Grievances/Complaints related to Ragging should be dealt by Anti-Ragging Committee of the University.
4. Provision should be included in the guidelines that any grievance sent directly to Vice-Chancellor and Registrar will not be entertained and will be routed through the appropriate level of escalation matrix.

Decision : The Board of Management considered the recommendations of the Academic Council and approved the Students Grievance Redressal Policy and Grievance Redressal Escalation matrix with above mentioned modifications.



Agenda 58.18 : Starting of M.Tech in Green Buildings & Sustainable Built Environment, a Nationally benchmarked flagship Masters programme offered Jointly by Delhi Technological University and GRIHA Council.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that India is at a critical juncture in its urbanisation and infrastructure development trajectory, with the built environment increasingly shaped by energy efficiency mandates, climate commitments, digitalisation, and performance-based regulation. Regulatory instruments such as the National Building Code (NBC), Energy Conservation and Sustainable Building Code (ECSBC), municipal bye-laws, and sustainability disclosures are progressively influencing project approvals, asset valuation, and investment decisions across public and private sectors.

While short-term certification and capacity-building programmes address awareness and procedural familiarity, there exists a clear gap in advanced, engineering-led postgraduate education capable of producing professionals who can design, analyse, model, and optimise building performance across energy, water, materials, carbon, and digital systems in an integrated manner.

Delhi Technological University (DTU), with its long-standing legacy in engineering education and research, provides academic rigour, multidisciplinary depth, and degree-granting authority. GRIHA Council, as India's national green building rating and knowledge institution, contributes domain expertise, policy linkage, and access to applied industry and public-sector engagements.

The proposed joint M.Tech programme is conceived as a DTU-led academic degree, supported by GRIHA Council as a principal national knowledge partner, to create a nationally benchmarked, future-ready postgraduate programme in green buildings and the sustainable built environment.

Programme Objectives

The M.Tech in Green Buildings & Sustainable Built Environment is designed to create engineering-led, analytically capable, and policy-aware professionals equipped to address the technical and sustainability challenges of India's rapidly evolving built environment sector.

The programme aims to develop graduates who can design, analyse, simulate, and optimise high-performance and net-zero buildings by integrating principles of building science, energy systems, water efficiency, materials sustainability, life-cycle assessment, and digital technologies. Strong emphasis is placed on quantitative performance evaluation, use of advanced modelling tools, and application of codes and standards governing the built environment.



A key objective of the programme is to enable students to critically apply and compare multiple green building assessment and performance frameworks prevalent in India and internationally. While national frameworks form the primary reference for regulatory alignment, the curriculum adopts a comparative and rating-agnostic academic approach, ensuring that graduates are not limited to familiarity with any single system.

The programme further seeks to develop competencies in life-cycle costing, carbon accounting, ESG analysis, renewable integration, and smart building systems, enabling graduates to function effectively across consultancy, infrastructure development, public institutions, and policy advisory roles. At the same time, the programme builds a strong foundation for applied research and doctoral pathways in building science, sustainability, and climate policy.

Upon completion of the programme, graduates will be able to:

- Design and optimise high-performance and net-zero buildings using advanced engineering tools
- Analyse building performance across energy, water, materials, and carbon dimensions
- Apply and compare Indian and international green building frameworks for assessment and benchmarking
- Integrate renewable energy, circularity, and digital systems into building design and operation
- Undertake applied research and evidence-based problem-solving in the built environment sector

Programme Details

The proposed programme shall be offered as a two-year, four-semester, full-time M.Tech degree titled M.Tech in Green Buildings & Sustainable Built Environment, awarded by Delhi Technological University, in accordance with UGC and DTU regulations. An additional format of M.Tech by applied research will also be offered with basic fundamental studies in first Semester followed by three semesters of applied research.

The programme shall carry a total academic load of 80 credits as per AICTE, inclusive of coursework, studios, internship, and thesis components, and is proposed to commence from the Academic Year 2026–27, subject to statutory approvals. The programme shall admit 30 students per batch, enabling intensive studio-based learning, close faculty interaction, and meaningful industry and field engagement.

The primary mode of delivery shall be on-campus at DTU. Selective hybrid components, including expert lectures, site-based learning, workshops, and applied modules delivered with support from GRIHA Council and industry partners, may be integrated to enhance applied exposure without compromising academic control or regulatory compliance.



The programme may be pursued under a degree-oriented or applied research-oriented pathway, as per DTU norms, with academic requirements and evaluation standards governed solely by DTU.

Revenue Sharing Model

The programme is proposed with an indicative initial tuition fee as per DTU norms.

Tuition revenue shall be shared between DTU and GRIHA Council in a mutually agreed ratio, reflecting their respective academic, instructional, and domain contributions. Any revenue sharing arrangement shall be subject to DTU's financial rules and applicable statutory guidelines.

Additional revenues arising from executive education modules, sponsored projects, consultancy assignments, and research grants shall be shared as per mutually agreed norms and funding guidelines. Any net surplus generated shall be ring-fenced and reinvested for curriculum enhancement, laboratory and digital infrastructure, faculty development, international collaboration, and student support, ensuring long-term academic sustainability.

Strategic Benefits

For Delhi Technological University, the programme establishes a flagship, industry-linked M.Tech offering in green buildings, strengthening alignment with national climate and sustainability priorities, enhancing institutional visibility, and enabling high-quality postgraduate education with limited incremental infrastructure requirements.

For GRIHA Council, the collaboration provides a structured academic platform to strengthen research, innovation, and capacity building, create a long-term talent pipeline, and deepen engagement with academia while reinforcing its national leadership role in the sustainable built environment domain.

The matter along with details of Eligibility Criteria, Curriculum Structure, Overall Academic Positioning, Teaching and Delivery Model, Governance & Quality Assurance, Certifications and Value Addition, Career Pathways, Implementation Timeline etc. were placed before the Academic Council in its 44th meeting held on 26.02.2026. The Academic Council considered and recommended the matter to the Board of Management for approval of Nationally Benchmarked Flagship Masters programme offered jointly by 'Delhi Technological University' and 'GRIHA Council' with following stipulations:

1. The curriculum and scheme of the program should be as per the approved curriculum and scheme of M.Tech program in DTU.



2. Remove the “or other qualifications deemed appropriate by DTU” from the eligibility criteria.
3. Separate curriculum should be formulated for M.Tech by Research program.

Decision : The Board of Management considered the recommendations of Academic Council and approved for starting of M.Tech in Green Buildings & Sustainable Built Environment, a Nationally benchmarked flagship Masters programme offered Jointly by Delhi Technological University and GRIHA Council.



Agenda 58.19 : In-principle approval for Four-Year B.Tech program in Geoinformatics under Multidisciplinary Department of Geospatial Science and Technology (DGST).

It was submitted to the Board of Management that post its approval vide BOM Agenda 51.16, a new **Multidisciplinary Department of Geospatial Science and Technology (DGST)** has been established in DTU. All the existing assets and the programs of **Multidisciplinary Centre for Geo-informatics (MCG) has been merged in the new Department. Currently**, the Department is offering Ph.D, M.Tech and M.Tech by Research in Geoinformatics, and M.Sc in Geospatial Science programs.

The approved Vision of the Department is "To be a leading Multidisciplinary Nodal Centre in the Field of 'Geospatial Sciences and Technologies' through diverse multidisciplinary academic programs, innovation, research, consultancy, enterprise development and policy research'. **One of the primary Objectives behind upgrading the MCG to a Department is to launch UG programs in Geospatial Science and Technology. Accordingly, it is now proposed to launch the first UG program of the Department i.e four year B.Tech in Geo-informatics.**

Brief Justification – Following merit consideration -

- (a) **Global Geospatial Scenario-** United Nations has constituted a Committee known as United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) which aims to promote use of geospatial information within national and global policy frameworks. All the SDIs globally use geospatial technologies in planning and monitoring their goals. India being a UN member is actively involved in implementing UNGGIM guidelines. Further, Geospatial Market and Economy Report of 2024 predicts \$133 Billion Geospatial Market and \$1.09 Trillion Socio-Economic Benefits for USA alone by 2030.
- (b) **Indian Geospatial Scenario -** India, today, aspires to be a five trillion economy by 2030 and envisions becoming a developed nation by 2047. The country is witnessing certain socioeconomic, political, military, academic and technological changes at a speed and scale never witnessed before. Geospatial Information is considered extremely essential for efficient socioeconomic management of any Country. Indian Geospatial economy is growing at a CAGR of 12.8 % per annum and according to a 'The Economic Times' estimate, the Indian Geospatial Economy is likely to hit a target of 1 Lakh Crore by 2030. In the recent past, the Govt of India has announced several new policies which include the New Space Policy, the Geospatial policy, the new Drone rules etc. Various ISRO missions, such as Chandrayaan missions, the Aditya L-1 mission, Mangalyaan mission (for Mars probe) and the Gaganyaan mission are other

technological milestones that are likely to ignite and attract the young passionate minds towards research in these fields. The last India – Pakistan conflict, Op – Sindoor has significantly highlighted the need for developing expertise in this field at the National level. DTU has recently, concluded two prestigious MoUs with Indian Army and Indian Air Force who are willing to extend research and Internships support to our students.

- (c) **Academic Gap at DTU –Besides**, it is also pointed out that amongst the new Startups at DTU, many students are working on related Technologies but yet there is no UG program in this field in DTU. Equally important, DTU had proposed introduction of “Geomatics” as a subject in GATE which has since been implemented, yet DTU has hardly any B.Tech student taking this exam.

Following are the salient aspects of the proposed program -

- (a) **Name of the Program** – B.Tech (Geoinformatics)
(b) **Number of Seats** – 60 (as per AICTE norms)
(c) **Admission/Eligibility** – Through JEE as for all other B.Tech programs in DTU

Following preparedness exists to launch the new program -

- (a) **Faculty – as under**
(i) Two Visiting Professors, one Distinguished Professor of Practice and one Adjunct faculty have already joined
(ii) 08 vacancies have been transferred to DGST vide BOM 57.32
(iii) Regular intake of Ph.D students and Post -Docs where possible
(b) **Infrastructure** - The existing available infrastructure within DTU will be sufficient. There will however, will be a requirement of certain new Labs and equipment which will be built up in due course.
(c) **Market Analysis** – Two Conferences have been held on 18 Nov 2024 and 05 Dec 2025 wherein members from Govt, Industry and Academia participated. The Industry welcomed the initiative and is willing to absorb the students provided they are equipped with adequate Geospatial skills. Besides, it is also informed that Indian Army has also included B.Tech (Geoinformatics) for recruitment in their TGC (Technical Graduate Course) scheme.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council in its 44th meeting held on 26.02.2026. The Council recommended the matter to the Board of Management for in-principle approval for Four-Year B.Tech program in Geoinformatics under Multidisciplinary Department of Geospatial Science and Technology (DGST).

Decision : The Board of Management considered the recommendations of Academic Council and approved in-principle for Four-Year B.Tech program in Geo-informatics under Multidisciplinary Department of Geospatial Science and Technology (DGST).



Agenda 58.20 : Clearing/Closing the Probation Period of the Assistant Professor appointed in DTU.

The Board was apprised that **01 faculty member namely Ms. Sonal Singh (ECE)** was appointed in DTU in the year 2020 and she has completed her probation period as indicated in her offer of appointment.

In this regard, a committee was constituted by the Competent Authority under the Chairmanship of Prof. Prateek Sharma, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, DTU to examine the matter regarding clearing/ closing the probation period of the Assistant Professor(s) appointed in DTU.

The committee examined **the Special APAR, Probation Closing/Ending Report, Work and Conduct Certificates, Integrity Certificates, Character and Antecedents and Medical examination reports, Attendances report extend to more than 75% of total probation period of 01 faculty member.** The committee considered AICTE Notification F.61-1/RIFD/7th CPC/2016-17 dated 01.03.2019, File No. 1-29/MS/AICTE/2020 dated 08.07.2020 and office order No. 28020/3/2018-Estt.(C) dated 11.03.2019 regarding Master Circular on Probation/Confirmation in Central Services. Consequent upon scrutiny & review of these documents.

The committee recommended clearing/closing of the probation period of the faculty members detailed below from the dates indicated mentioned against their name.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the recommendations of the committee for closing/clearing the probation period of the above mentioned 01 faculty member appointed in DTU.

Agenda 58.21 : Hiring of Public Relations Officer (PRO) in DTU.

It was apprised that the Board of Management in its 57th meeting held on 12.12.2025 vide Suppl. agenda item No.57.39 has considered and approved the hiring of Public Relations Officer (PRO) for handling the media visibility and outreach of the University.

In view of the above, an application has been received (CV was placed as Annexure in the Supplementary Agenda note) from a candidate with the requisite experience. With over 15 years of expertise in television production, strategic communication, public relations, and social media advisory, she is presently serving as the Head, Media Communication & Public Relations Division at the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), Ministry of Home Affairs, where she also serves as the Nodal Officer for the Capacity Building Commission (CBC). Further, she has been leading India's e-learning initiatives under iGOT and Mission Karmayogi at NIDM, focusing on disaster risk communication, media literacy, and capacity-building.

The Board is further apprised that vide Suppl. Agenda 57.39, it is submitted that given her rich professional background, she will be able to significantly contribute to media outreach and PR activities of the University, support the media outreach activities of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor's Office, contribute to the development of modules for the office of Digital Education and strengthen the University's Media Outreach Campaigns.

It is further apprised that the information regarding the last salary drawn by Ms. Nazia from the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM) has been obtained by this office vide email dated 02.01.2026 and as per records of NIDM, Ms. Nazia was paid a consolidated remuneration of Rs.1,65,000/- per month for the month of November 2025. Further, she has requested a minimum enhancement of 20-20% over her existing remuneration.

Therefore, by considering her present monthly remuneration received from NIDM, it is proposed that an additional increment of Rs.5000 may be granted to her on the existing salary of Rs.1,65,000/-(approx. 3% increment, as applicable to any Government employees). Accordingly, she may be offered a consolidated fixed remuneration of Rs.1,70,000/- per month and the tenure of appointment to the post of PRO may initially be for a period of one year, which may be extended further based on her performance.

Decision : The Board of Management Meeting considered and approved the hiring of Ms. Nazia as Public Relation Officer (PRO) in DTU as proposed against any other vacant sanctioned Group-A post.

Agenda 58.22 : Amendment in Clause 7(3) and 8(3) of Delhi Technological University (First) Statutes, 2009, related to the age of retirement of Registrar and Controller of Finance of the University.

It was apprised that the Board of Management in its 57th meeting held on 12.12.2025 vide Agenda item No. 57.25 has considered and approved for amendment in the Clause 7(3) and Clause 8(3) of Delhi Technological University (First) Statutes, 2009 regarding age of retirement of Registrar, Controller of Finance of the University from 60 years to 62 years.

However, on further examination of the matter in DTU and DTTE, it was emerged that it would be better if age of retirement of these Statutory posts be linked with the UGC norms rather than specifying a specific age.

Accordingly, it is proposed that the relevant clauses in Delhi Technological University (First) Statutes, 2009 are amended as follows:

Further, the age of retirement in respect of Controller of Examination may also be modified on similar lines i.e. as prescribed by the UGC from time to time.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the amendment in Delhi Technological University (First) Statutes, 2009 related to the age of retirement of Registrar and Controller of Finance as prescribed by the UGC from time to time and send the proposal to the Hon'ble Chancellor for his assent.

Further, the Board also approved the change in age of retirement in respect of Controller of Examination of the University as prescribed by the UGC from time to time.



Agenda 58.23 : Position of Dean (Faculty Affairs) and its Role & Responsibilities.

The Board of Management was apprised that the University proposes to create a position for Dean (Faculty Affairs) to look after the matters relating to the faculty members of the University which was presented and recommended in the meeting of Administrative Reform Committee with all Deans.

The detailed roles and responsibilities of the Dean (Faculty Affairs) shall be as under:

1. Faculty Career Progression & Service Matters

- Oversee implementation of Career Advancement Scheme (CAS), promotions, and upgradations of faculty members.
- Process matters related to confirmation, probation, deputation, lien, study leave, sabbatical, and other service-related requests.
- Maintain oversight on interpretation and application of service rules in coordination with Establishment Branch.

2. Performance Evaluation & Appraisal

- Supervise the Annual Performance Appraisal System (APAR/PBAS) for faculty members.
- Ensure timely submission, review, and forwarding of appraisal reports to competent authorities.
- Facilitate feedback mechanisms for continuous improvement in teaching, research, and academic service.

3. Faculty Development & Capacity Building

- Plan, coordinate, and promote Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs), orientation programmes, refresher courses, and training initiatives. Execution through HRDC.
- Encourage faculty participation in research, consultancy, innovation, patents, and academic collaborations.
- Support implementation of NEP 2020 initiatives related to faculty upskilling and multidisciplinary teaching. Execution through HRDC.

4. Academic Governance & Policy Implementation

- Assist the Vice-Chancellor in formulation and implementation of academic and faculty-related policies approved by the Academic Council, Executive Council, and Board of Governors.
- Ensure compliance with UGC, AICTE, AIU, and Government of NCT of Delhi regulations concerning faculty matters.



5. Coordination with Departments and Schools

- Act as the nodal academic interface between the University administration and academic departments/schools on faculty-related matters.
- Address faculty grievances and facilitate resolution through appropriate institutional mechanisms.

6. Disciplinary and Vigilance Matters

- Assist the Competent Authority in processing disciplinary cases, vigilance references, and complaints related to faculty members, in accordance with prescribed rules and principles of natural justice.

7. Representation & Committees

- Serve as Member/Chairperson on statutory and administrative committees related to faculty affairs.
- Represent the University in academic and policy forums, as assigned by the Vice-Chancellor.

8. Record Management and Reporting

- Ensure proper maintenance of faculty service records, digital databases, and compliance documentation.
- Prepare and submit periodic reports to the Vice-Chancellor, Executive Council, and other statutory bodies.

9. Any Other Responsibility Assigned

- Perform any other academic or administrative functions entrusted by the Vice-Chancellor or competent authority in the interest of the University.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved for the position of Dean (Faculty Affairs) with its roles and responsibilities.



Agenda 58.24 : Renaming of the Department of Training & Placement as the Office of Career Development & Industry Engagement (OCDIE) and re-designation of Head and Associate Head to Dean and Associate Dean (Career Development & Industry Engagement)

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Department of Training & Placement presently facilitates campus recruitment and industry interaction. In view of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and evolving institutional requirements relating to internships, experiential learning, industry-academia collaboration, entrepreneurship, and diversified career pathways, a broader career development framework is required beyond a placement-centric structure.

Accordingly, renaming and re-designation of positions of the Department is proposed.

It is proposed that:

1. The Department of Training & Placement be renamed and re-designated as the **Office of Career Development & Industry Engagement (OCDIE)**.
2. The position of **HOD (Training & Placement)** be re-designated as **Dean (Career Development & Industry Engagement)**.
3. The position of **Associate Head (Training & Placement)** be re-designated as **Associate Dean (Career Development & Industry Engagement)**.

The Dean shall report directly to the Vice-Chancellor.

The proposed renaming and re-designation will:

- Align the University framework with NEP 2020 provisions on internships and employability;
- Institutionalize structured career development from the first year onward;
- Strengthen industry partnerships and experiential learning;
- Broaden measurable career outcomes beyond placement statistics.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved the following:

1. The renaming of the Department of Training & Placement as the **Office of Career Development & Industry Engagement (OCDIE)**; and
2. The re-designation of the positions of **Head and Associate Head (Training & Placement)** as **Dean and Associate Dean (Career Development & Industry Engagement)**.

In this regard, a committee was constituted to look into the various issues related to payment with M/s VCS. The Committee deliberated on the matter and noted the following points;

- (i) Complaints of payment related issues has been reported from the Outsourced employees deployed through M/s VCS.
- (ii) The amount of contract with M/s VCS is approximately 15% only of the contract with M/s Sai Ram Security and Placement Services.
- (iii) Contract of M/s VCS is valid up to 15.12.2025 only and retendering at this stage will take another 03 months to materialize.

Based on the above justification, the committee recommended to shift the existing outsourced manpower from M/s Vaishnavi Consultancy Services to M/s Sai Ram Security and Placement Services.

It was stated that the Annual Cost after shifting of manpower stated at sub para 2 above to M/s SRSPS will be approx. ₹10,41,78,943.50/- (Rs. 9,70,85,313/- (Skilled and Semi-Skilled workmen, M/s SRSPS) + Rs. 7093630.50/- (highly skilled workmen, M/s VCS, Six Month Salary) (Rupees Ten Crores Forty-One Thousand Seventy-Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-Three and Fifty Paise Only) calculated in accordance with the minimum wages prescribed by the Govt. of NCT of Delhi, as on date.

It was mentioned that the financial powers upto ₹10 crore vests with the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor in a single transaction, and above ₹10 crore with BOM.

Keeping in view of the above, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor has approved the above mentioned proposal for continuation of services of these manpower w.e.f. 16.12.2026.

Suppl. Agenda 58.33 : Honorary position of “Distinguished Professor (Practice)” to Lt. Gen. R. S. Raman

The Board of Management is hereby apprised that in its 55th meeting held on 27.05.2025 vide agenda 55.18 the Board has approved the guidelines for engagement of Distinguished Professor (Practice) which have been notified vide notification number F.DTU/Council/BOM-AC/Notification/71/2025/P-I/636 dated 26.06.2025.

As per Clause D of the notification pertaining to process of selection, *‘Nomination by Vice Chancellor, DTU. Vice Chancellor, DTU may nominate Distinguished Faculty-Practice from amongst the eminent foreign national, Professional and Government servant (in active service/retired) including Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) who has achieved the highest levels of accolades/earned national or international level distinction.*

The Board is apprised that Lt. Gen. R. S. Raman is highly distinguished Indian Army officer who has reached the pinnacle of military service through his exemplary achievements. In view of his exemplary service to the nation, he was invited to deliver a Distinguished Speaker Series (DSS) lecture at DTU. Geo-intelligence being a common thread between DGST and Indian Army, he was requested to consider joining Department of Geospatial Science and Technology (DGST) as Distinguished Professor of Practice upon his superannuation. He has now confirmed that post his superannuation on 30 April 2026, he will be available to join DGST as Distinguished Professor of Practice.

It is submitted that his association as Distinguished Professor of Practice is expected to significantly strengthen academic and research collaboration between DGST and the Indian Army. His vast experience will also be beneficial for other departments of DTU in enhancing institutional linkage with the Indian Army and DRDO. A brief CV of Lt. Gen. R. S. Raman was placed as Annexure in the Agenda Note.

Decision : The Board of Management considered and approved for conferment of Honorary position of “Distinguished Professor (Practice)” to Lt. Gen. R. S. Raman in the Department of Geospatial Science and Technology, DTU.

The Board of Management is hereby apprised that is submitted that Dr. Nupur Srivastava has joined as Controller of Examinations on a tenure based post w.e.f. 16/12/2026 in this University. The officer has requested campus accommodation as per her entitlement.

The Board of Management has already approved the House Allotment Rules of the University in its 15th meeting held on 08/01/2015, which were later revised in the 51st meeting held on 05/07/2024. Certain residential accommodations have been earmarked for employees of Delhi Technological University under the said allotment rules.

Clause 5, “Essential Services”, of the existing House Allotment Rules, 2024 (as amended) is defined as under :-

“Services as given in this section shall be counted as essential services and houses as shown will be earmarked for employees hired against them including those who may be on deputation/contract or temporary hiring” :-

5.1.1	Registrar	- 01 Type V house
5.1.2	Controller of Finance	- 01 Type V house
5.1.3	Any Dy Registrar/ Asst Registrar or equivalent official	- 01 Type IV house (Certain official on deputation/contract if deemed appropriate by the Vice Chancellor may be considered for such an allotment for a specified period).
5.1.4	Medical Doctor	- 01 Type IV house
5.1.5	Nursing Assistant	- 01 Type II house (The allotment will made to one married nursing employee/staff and in case of bachelors more than one nursing or any other employee/ staff with the approval of the Vice Chancellor).
5.1.6	Executive Engineer	-.01 Type IV house
5.1.7	Assistant Engineer	- 01 Type III house
5.1.8	Junior Engineer Staff	- 01 Type II house (Preference will be for JE-Electrical, however in case of bachelors, the house will be shared between more than one Engineer or any other employee/staff with the approval of the Vice Chancellor).
5.1.9	Security Staff	- 01 Type II house (The allotment will made to one married security employee/staff and in case of bachelors more than one security or any other employee/staff with the approval of the Vice Chancellor).



5.1.10	Clerical Staff	- 01 Type II house (The allotment will made to one married clerical employee/staff and in case of bachelors more than one clerical or any other employee/staff with the approval of the Vice Chancellor).
5.1.11	Driving Staff	- 01 Type II house (The allotment will made to one married driving employee/staff and in case of bachelors more than one driving or any other employee/staff with the approval of the Vice Chancellor).
5.1.12	Any other staff considered against any other service approved to be an essential service with the approval of the Vice Chancellor.	- Any appropriate House depending upon the entitled category of the staff

Since examination activities are also considered essential services of the University, it is proposed to include the post of **Controller of Examinations** in the list of designated employees. Accordingly, a **Type V accommodation** may be earmarked for the Controller of Examinations.

Decision : The Board of Management duly considered and approved to provide residential accommodation within the campus for the Controller of Examinations, subject to the availability of a vacant quarter as per Rule.

Furthermore, in order to earmark residential accommodation for the Controller of Examinations under the category of Essential Services, the DTU House Allotment Rules/ Regulations require appropriate amendment. The Board of Management directed that the proposal be examined by the duly constituted committee for the purpose of amending the relevant Regulation.



Concluding Remarks

At the end, Sh. Sandeep Kumar Singh, Special Secretary, Finance, GNCTD with permission of chair, raised following points:

- 1. He expressed his concern over 50% vacancies in teaching posts and 75% vacancies in non-teaching posts. He requested to fill these vacant posts as soon as possible.*
- 2. He observed that DTU (Erstwhile DCE) was among the Top-10 Engineering institutions around the year 2004. But, of late, ranking has been declined in the NIRF and other rankings. He requested the University to take necessary steps to improve upon the ranking of the University.*

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, responding to the above points, informed that University is taking all the necessary steps to fill up the vacant posts both in teaching and non-teaching in mission mode. He further explained that in the five verticals of NIRF ranking, DTU is performing well in three verticals, however, in the verticals of Research and Perception, University needs to improved upon. Further, he informed that the University is in the process of submitting a White Paper to the office of Hon'ble Chancellor suggesting the measures and requirement of government support for improving the rankings. Further to this, the Registrar and Member Secretary of the Board, augmented the comments of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor regarding filling of the vacancies in mission mode with information that the University is at the advance stage of implementing flexi cadre in teaching posts, however, the same could not be placed as agenda in this meeting as it may take further one more week. As this is a very critical and important matter, he requested all the members to consider this agenda through circulation after recommendations of the Academic Council.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the members.

The minutes are issued with the approval of the Vice Chancellor for circulation to the Hon'ble members, who are requested to give their comments, if any, on these circulated minutes.
